



## **Amana Colonies Historic Revitalization Subgrant Program**

In 2024, the Amana Colonies Land Use District (ACLUD) was awarded \$750,000 through the Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization Grant (PBHRG) program from the National Park Service, Department of the Interior. The objective of the Paul Bruhn Historic Revitalization grant program is to support the rehabilitation of historic properties at the National, State, and local level of significance to rehabilitate, protect, and foster economic development in rural communities (less than 50,000 population).

### **Who is able to apply for these funds?**

- Private property owners
- Businesses
- For profit developers
- Tax exempt entities
- Public institutions

### **How can the funds be used?**

The funds can be used for structures built prior to 1932 and located within the ACLUD boundaries. The building must be a contributing structure to the Amana Colonies National Historic Landmark. Property must be owned by the applicant.

### **What can funds pay for?**

Applicants may apply for funding for predevelopment and construction purposes. Plans for all physical preservation work must comply with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Historic Preservation and all projects must adhere to any additional applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations, codes and ordinances including the ACLUD Design Guidelines. Grant requests shall be no less than \$25,000 and no more than \$175,000.

### **Grant Submission and Due Date Requirements**

The ACHR Grant Subgrant Program will accept applications annually until all funds are disbursed.

The first round of applications closes on May 15, 2026.
